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#### Definitions of births adopted in Georgia

# Georgia follows the WHO recommendations to define the live birth and stillbirth since 1996

- A baby consider as a live birth if she/he has a no breath but other signs of life or died during the first 7 days or survived the first 7 days
- A baby is considered stillbirth if it born with no signs of life at or after 22 weeks' gestation






#### Number of Live Birth and Death since 1990

## The system of collecting the data of death and birth The new system, 2003-2010






The current system since 2011

#### Causes of death statistics in Georgia

When a person dies, mainly doctors records the cause of death on a death certificate which is sent to Public Service Development Agency, but if death occurred **outside of Medical Institution** the local authority is obligatory to fill the death certificate according to the answers of family member and some cases the form about causes of death certificate is empty

Geostat using dual coding (IRIS and manually) system for coding of causes of death


**ANACOD** program used to check the quality of data
